SERVING AMERICA'S MILITARY FAMILIES DURING A GLOBAL PANDEMIC



Since March 2020, we have fulfilled over **1,700 CFA/COVID-19 requests** from military families, providing over **\$1 million in assistance**. Overall, since 2011, our CFA program has fulfilled more than **46,000 requests** from military families, providing them with over **\$30 million in assistance**.

STORY FROM THE HOMEFRONT

Marine veteran Alexander Tettey Jr. had recently completed training to become an emergency medical technician, but before he could start a new job, the global pandemic made the work too risky. Alexander cares for his disabled father, who lives with him. With his father being high risk for contracting COVID-19, Alexander could not take the chance of bringing the virus home.

Keeping up with bills became challenging because of the lack of work and unanticipated expenses, including the funeral expenses that Alexander and his father covered when his uncle passed away. During the pandemic, Alexander reached out for help twice and received support through Operation Homefront's Critical Financial Assistance (CFA) program.

Thanks to Operation Homefront's generous donors, Alexander was able to cover the costs of several overdue housing payments. "The assistance was a great help," Alexander said. "It took the pressure off so we could catch up. That was really what we needed to get back on track. The other resources, like financial coaching, helped to shore up our future finances."

After serving his country for 11 years, Alexander wants Operation Homefront's donors to know he is grateful for their support. "I'm incredibly appreciative," Alexander said. "I do hope (donors) understand how vital it is just to have that one piece of help that can fill a gap that can allow me to care for my dad. If we didn't get that assistance, I don't know what would have happened. The financial assistance came at a pivotal fork in the road, and I'm glad it was there to steer us in the right direction."
